

Biannual Trustee Statement

Q3-4 2024

As part of our ongoing commitment to build a robust foundation for those displaced by war or catastrophe, we are creating an ongoing biannual statement by the Chair Trustee that endeavours to provide information to our donors, stakeholders, and beneficiaries on our current and future position.

Our first year as an official charity started on 1 July 2024 when we were officially recognised by the UK Charity Commission as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. We were however founded on 19 November 2023.

We are a non-political, non-affiliated organisation with an established code of ethics which will enable us to work affectively as a volunteer-led charity.

This substantial period since founding has enabled us to establish our safeguarding policies, risk assessments and stakeholder relationships to aid our beneficiaries. In addition, our team has grown to provide a combined experience of over 50 years in our field and our stakeholders include the finest CPO's, consultants, P&O manufacturers, and the best universities in the United Kingdom.

Our scientific approach enables us to provide detailed PMR assessment's specialized towards blast injury, and our consultants can provide advice to the most complex injury that requires P&O. We have stakeholders in place to assist our beneficiaries for long term rehabilitation and pain management. We have safeguarding systems and whistleblowing in place for our pathways with risk assessments that ensure beneficiary safety and donor funds are used appropriately, monitoring the use of end funds and the patient journey.

We offer free consultations, advice, and guidance to those who fit our criteria, which are displaced Gazan's with blast injury, according to official statistics (Save the Children, UNICEF), there are at least 5000 new amputees who all lack the infrastructure for proper care.

Our work will result in clinical results that will enable the regrowth of medical infrastructure in the areas we work in, more advanced than before.

This enables us to operate affectively as a charity under the rules and regulations of the UK Charity Commission and the advice by the FCDO.

Our system is accountable, legal and in the public interest.



Helping those walk again, through complex blast injury, whilst assessing overall health and long-term rehabilitation and improving the outlook for the most vulnerable and needy individuals in the world, whether they are children, or elderly is an honour for the LZF team, and a necessary endeavour.

Having a system in place that ensures prioritization of the most-needy patients referred to us allows us to display proper use of donations and allows us to aid the most medically vulnerable patients.

As of 28 August 2024, we have paid for our first two medically vulnerable patients to receive prosthesis. A process that could take 4-6 weeks.

We have a waiting list of patients and now require donations to support our cause, as a short-term goal we are aiming for 100,000 GBP in donations.

We look forward to bringing you positive outcomes through our work.
